Institution Mission Statement: Atlantic University's mission is to provide a high quality graduate-level distance education learning environment for adult learners that integrates body, mind, and spirit to help people achieve higher human potential and transform their lives, better understand their relationship to all life, and be of profound service to others.

Areas of Special Focus (e.g., allied health training, etc.) Masters of Arts in Transpersonal Studies

Description of Institution: Atlantic University is a not-for-profit online graduate school offering a Masters of Arts in Transpersonal Studies. Located on the campus of the Edgar Cayce's Association for Research and Enlightenment in Virginia Beach, Virginia, Atlantic University received its charter in 1930 with a vision of offering a liberal arts education through a holistic perspective. Struggling in the economic climate at the beginning of the Great Depression, Atlantic University remained open for only two years. The vision was kept alive in the minds of a group of individuals who kept the charter in force with the hope of once again opening AU's doors. Finally in 1985, Atlantic University reopened as a residential graduate school with a curriculum that focused on the interdisciplinary field of transpersonal studies. In 1994, Atlantic University adopted a distance learning model instituting one-on-one correspondence courses and achieved its first accreditation from the Distance Education and Training Council in the same year. In the fall of 2010, AU changed its instructional model to a three-semester online course delivery model. In addition to its academic programs, AU also offers professional continuing education self-directed web-based courses, non-credit continuing education versions of its academic courses, some of which carry CEUs approved by such agencies as the Yoga Alliance and the National Board for Certified Counselors. Atlantic University also sponsors an active personal enrichment program that includes events, workshops, an annual conference and adult education courses.

Student Demographic Profile: The typical Atlantic University student is female, US-based, between the ages of 40 and 60, and interested in personal enrichment and personal transformation. However, the student

body includes individuals from their twenties to their eighties of both sexes from 13 countries around the world with a variety of reasons for taking the Master's program.

Courses/Programs/Degrees: Masters of Arts in Transpersonal Studies

Average Program Tuition/Cost per credit hour: Academic courses are \$340 a credit hour or \$1020 a course; Continuing education versions of the academic program courses are \$750 per course.
